These classes will be determined by their Maths sets for years 8 and 9 and students will remain in the same classroom with teachers moving rooms. The rationale for choosing maths groups was a longer-term consideration that the KS4 maths exam is tiered whereas the English is not. Therefore, we did not want to adversely influence the tier students would have to be entered in for GCSE whilst still in year 8/9. Form groups will be the same bubbles students are in for lessons and form time will take place within their bubble classroom. Year 7 will initially be in mixed ability groups with a view to then set them into permanent groups following October half-term. Year 10 and 11 will each be large year group bubbles and although we will avoid mixing between the year groups, there will be mixing within the year group to allow students to study their chosen options. Whilst this means there will be students from different year groups in the LSH, it is only for a small number of students and with distancing between year groups the risk is minimised.
