The gap between pupil premium and non-pupil premium achieving 3 levels progress has remained small, with values for both sets of students increasing in 2015 significantly for Mathematics.

Year 11 English pupil premium students made progress in line with non-pupil premium students.

Year 11 Mathematics pupil premium students make expected progress 10% lower than non-pupil premium students.

46% of pupil premium students achieved 5 A*-C grade GCSEs including English and Mathematics.

<u>Attendance</u>

Academy attendance has improved every year since 2010 and 2015 figures show 94.3% attendance and 7.30% PA for the whole cohort. The Academy % attendance and PA is below national average. However this figure is improving and the gap is closing. The Academy employs two Attendance Officers and an Attendance Coach who work with a caseload of students to improve levels of attendance and reduce PA. The Academy will continue to develop strategies for improvement, focussing on target groups within each year group.
