

Pupils are celebrating their record breaking GCSE achievements at Sandwell's highest performing school. GCSE results show that Bristnall Hall Academy's 2019 Year 11 cohort has made outstanding progress in numerous subjects, including both English and Mathematics.

These results demonstrate success for the fifth consecutive year and once again reinforce Bristnall Hall Academy's outstanding performance. Attainment at the highest grades was particularly impressive, with several pupils achieving Grade 9 and Grade 8 passes in English, Mathematics and other EBacc subjects. As an SSAT Leading Edge school, Bristnall Hall Academy has successfully embedded the new, more challenging GCSE examinations across its entire curriculum offer. This has helped to ensure that students have been highly successful in their studies, regardless of background or ability, making exceptional progress as a result. Amongst the numerous Bristnall Hall Academy students who are celebrating their success are Ellie Sheward, Callum Esprey, Brayden Birch, Francesca Barker and Lillie-Mae Clewer. These students achieved numerous top grades, positioning them amongst the top performing students nationally. Kully Uppal, Principal at Bristnall Hall Academy commented: "Students from our academy have

STEM CHALLENGE

During this academic year's extra-curricular enrichment offer of a STEM Club, students entered the Express and Star STEM Challenge to come up with a clever design to solve the dirty drinking water problems globally. Bristnall Hall Academy were mentored by AE Aerospace for the duration of the competition.

The STEM Sisters carried out some extensive research on how many countries do not have access to clean drinking water and used their findings to design and implement a model of their product. All their hard work and dedication paid off during the final at the Dudley College CAT where they pitched their design alongside other schools from the West Midlands. They were crowned 'Best Operating Model' sponsored by Laser Products, with three other schools also awarded for their designs.

All four winning teams will have the opportunity of a guided

tour of a car manufacturing company in Telford which works closely with Wolverhampton University. Bristnall's STEM Sisters have also been invited to AE Aerospace and Laser Process for a guided tour of their factories and an insight into the products they manufacture. The judges were impressed with how confident the all-girl team were and their strong teamwork skills portrayed to produce such an innovative design. One of the competitions main objectives was to introduce more girls into STEM careers.

ARMED AND READY

On Tuesday 2nd July the Academy Transformation Trust (ATT) hosted the largest Armed Forces Covenant signing in the West Midlands. A total of 23 Armed Forces Covenants were signed at the event held at The Queen Elizabeth Academy in Warwickshire.

The signatories were the ATT and all 22 of their member Academies. Having this number of signatories at one event is previously unheard of in the West Midlands Reserve Forces and Cadets Association (RFCA) region. The West Midland RFCA's Engagement Team have led on the organisation of this event alongside members of staff at the local Bristnall Hall Academy, whose Principal Vince Green was influential in getting ATT and its 22 Academies to sign the Armed Forces Covenant, demonstrating their commitment to and advocacy of the Covenant. Debbie Clinton, CEO of Academy Transformation Trust commented "This is a momentous day for ATT. Our partnership with, and respect for, the spirit and intent of the Armed Forces Covenant is hugely important. We are immensely proud to be part of such a vital national initiative. We will go on to celebrate loudly our support for such a significant national movement". Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant for Warwickshire, Mr Tim Cox, attended this first of a kind event. He was accompanied by his Lord Lieutenant's Cadet from the RAF Air Cadets, Cadet Flight Sergeant Lillian Marsh. The event was opened by Colonel (Ret'd) Richard Maybery QGM, Chief Executive of West Midland RFCA who spoke about the Associations and what all thirteen do. He was followed by Colonel Rosie Stone VR DL, Deputy

Commander Reserves for 11 Signal and West Midlands Brigade who spoke about the Military Academic Partnership. Philip Sinclair, Regional Employer Engagement Director at West Midland RFCA added "We are very excited about this event and delighted that all the member academies of the ATT have pledged support. We look forward to working alongside ATT and recognising their support in the future." The Armed Forces Covenant is a promise by the nation ensuring that those who serve or who have served in the Armed Forces, and their families, are treated fairly. The ATT and its member Academies have all committed pledges to demonstrate their support to the Armed Forces community, and to the principles of Covenant. The Academy Transformation Trust are a multi-academy trust of 22 primary and secondary academies based in the Midlands, East of England and East Anglia. Their vision is to ensure that all children and young people, regardless of their background, fulfil their educational potential and maximise their life chances. ATT are committed to working inclusively within their communities, embracing the varied localities they serve and are committed to honouring the Armed Forces Covenant and supporting our Armed Forces community.

Bristnall Hall Academy awarded £1000 grant

Once again this academic year BHA successfully secured a £1000 grant from West Bromwich Building Society (WBBS).

We will use the grant to further improve the outcomes and experiences of the young people in our care. We have been awarded the grant to be used for our intervention sessions and the free breakfast provision we provide at the academy to ensure every child has the same opportunities regardless of their socio-economic background which WBBS is proud to support. The building society helps charities in their branch network area and other parts of the West Midlands through a grant scheme, the Mercian Community Trust. Their grant is funded through their Community Account and administered in partnership with the Diocese of Lichfield. Grants are targeted at social wellbeing, disability, vulnerable children and various other charitable causes.





The Breakfast Show

On Friday 7th June Free Radio Birmingham came to BHA to interview us to find out why we offer breakfast provision at the academy.

Earlier this academic year we were again awarded a £1000 grant from Kellogg's Breakfast Club to use towards our free breakfast provision. Our breakfast provision provides an excellent springboard for students ensuring they start their day of learning with a healthy and well balanced meal. When students are fuelled and ready for learning they can concentrate for longer spans as research suggests and play a small part in supporting their wellbeing and outcomes. Following on from this Bristnall Hall Academy were selected in the West Midlands and given the opportunity to take part in Kellogg's campaign to look at breakfast clubs across the UK. BHA was part of a wider case study for a new research project led by Kellogg's and Childwise into the importance of breakfast clubs and how they can be a lifeline to families for various reasons.
