- 1. This Accessibility Plan has been drawn up in consultation with the Local Authority, students, parents, staff and governors of the Academy and covers the period from January 2021 January 2023.
- 2. We are committed to providing a fully accessible environment which values and includes all students, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotional and cultural needs. We are committed to challenging negative attitudes about disability and accessibility and to developing a culture of awareness, tolerance and inclusion.
- Bristnall Hall Academy plans to increase, over time, the accessibility of provision for all students, staff and visitors to the Academy. The Accessibility Plan will contain relevant actions to:
 - Improve access to the **physical environment** of the Academy, adding specialist facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of the Academy and physical aids to access education.
 - Increase access to the curriculum for students with a disability, expanding the
 curriculum as necessary to ensure that students with a disability are as, equally,
 prepared for life as are the able-bodied students; (If a school fails to do this they are
 in breach of the DDA). This covers teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of
 the Academy such as participation in after-school clubs, leisure and cultural activities
 or Academy visits. It also covers the provision of specialist aids and equipment,
 which may assist these students in accessing the curriculum.
 - Improve the delivery of **written information** to students, staff, parents and visitors with disabilities. Examples might include handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about the Academy and Academy events. The information should be made available in various preferred formats within a reasonable time frame.
- 4. Attached are Action Plans, relating to these key aspects of accessibility. These plans will be reviewed and adjusted on an annual basis. New Plans will be drawn up every three years.
- 5. We acknowledge that there is a need for ongoing awareness raising and training for staff and governors in the matter of disability discrimination and the need to inform attitudes on this matter.
- 6. The Accessibility Plan should be read in conjunction with the following policies, strategies and documents:

- 7. The Action Plan for physical accessibility relates to the Access Audit of the Academy, which is undertaken regularly by the Local Authority. It may not be feasible to undertake some of the works during the life of this first Accessibility Plan and therefore some items will roll forward into subsequent plans. The audit will need to be revisited prior to the end of each first three-year plan period in order to inform the development of the new Plan for the following period.
- 8. As curriculum policies are reviewed, a section relating to access will be added to that on Equality and Diversity. The terms of reference for all governors' committees will contain an item on "having regard to matters relating to Access".
- 9. The Academy Brochure will make reference to this Accessibility Plan.
- 10. The Academy's complaints procedure covers the Accessibility Plan.
- 11. Information about our Accessibility Plan will be published in the Governors' Annual Report to Parents (statutory).
- 12. The Plan will be monitored through the Curriculum and the Premises Committees of the Governors.
- 13. The Academy will work in partnership with the local education authority in developing and implementing this plan.
- 14. The Plan will be monitored by Ofsted as part of their inspection cycle.
