Creative: This is an open-ended opportunity for your child to explore a wide range of activities, such as the arts, technology, debate and more. This allows them to discover new passions and gain a broader perspective on their abilities, engaging their imagination, design and performance skills.

Physical: Fitness and a healthy lifestyle are crucial for the overall well-being of our students. These clubs focus on enhancing teamwork and leadership skills, and fostering a spirit of sportsmanship as well as supporting our student's mental wellbeing.

To reward high attendance to these opportunities the **Enrichment Diploma** is an annual award given to any pupil who attends a minimum of one club in each of the three categories across the academic year. It is an award which is designed to encourage pupils to sign-up and experience clubs that you may never have tried before. Whilst we still want pupils to sign-up for clubs that they are passionate about, we also want to encourage pupils to broaden their horizons and try something new. The Enrichment Diploma requires resilience and dedication to meet showing a commitment to our academy enrichment program. The reward for successful completion will be whole school recognition via your BHA enrichment diploma badge and a reward day off timetable for a trip to a theme park in September the following academic year.

Summary

Students will have the opportunity to read a wide range of fiction and non-fiction texts alongside engaging with Sparx Reader. Students will also have the chance to take part in bookmark competitions, books collections for local community and visits to local libraries such as Bleakhouse.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? Students will be able to develop and demonstrate their reading skills, be able to build on vocab and consolidate understanding of wider genres.

Chess Club

Summary

Chess is a board game for two players. It is played on a square board, made up of 64 smaller squares. Each player starts with 16 pieces: 8 pawns, 2 knights, 2 bishops, 2 rooks, 1 queen and 1 king. Each piece can travel across the board in different ways which impacts their power and importance to your strategy. The goal of the game is for each player to try and checkmate the king of the opponent. Checkmate is a threat ('check') to the opposing king which no move can stop. It ends the game.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain?

Problem solving, strategic thinking, the ability to thinking ahead and plan.

Debate Mate

Summary: In debating, students will work in groups to develop detailed arguments on topics they feel passionate about through structured discussions, honing their debating abilities in a supportive environment. Debate Mate is a full academic year programme which offers a structured curriculum that is run by an external provider and supported by the school. In Debate Mate students are taught how to become effective orators and persuasive speakers through the use of ancient and modern methods of public speaking. Students practice how to defend their points of view and to persuade the audience that their position is the right one. Debate Mate offers students the opportunity to attend competitions at other schools and universities in which they take part in debate battles as part of a team.

What knowledge or skills will I gain? Public speaking, confidence, academic vocabulary, how to build a persuasive argument, working in a team, leadership, listening, flexible thinking.

Russian Language Club For Beginners

Summary The BHA Russian Club offers students the chance to explore the Russian language and culture in an engaging and accessible way. Through weekly sessions, students will learn to read and write in the Cyrillic alphabet, build core vocabulary, and begin forming simple sentences. Alongside language learning, the club introduces students to key aspects of Russian history, literature, and culture, providing a well-rounded enrichment experience.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain?

Students will:

- Develop foundational knowledge of Russian, including the alphabet, vocabulary, and introductory grammar.
- Build confidence in speaking, listening, reading, and writing through practical activities.
- Gain cultural awareness by exploring Russian traditions, history, and literature.
- Strengthen cognitive skills such as problem-solving, memory, and pattern recognition through language study.
- Enhance transferable skills, including communication, curiosity, and global awareness.

How Does it Link to Future Careers?

Learning Russian opens doors to a wide range of future opportunities. Russian is:

- a major world language, spoken by over 250 million people across multiple countries in Eastern Europe and Central Asia,
- a strategic language in business, politics, science, and international relations,
- and an official language of the UN and other international organisations.

Skills gained through this club can support future careers in:

- International business and trade
- Diplomacy and government service (including the intelligence services e.g. MI5, GCHQ)
- Translation and interpreting
- Journalism and media
- Academia and research
- Travel, tourism, and cultural exchange
- Space exploration – all astronauts aboard the ISS have to learn Russian!

In addition, the cognitive and communication skills developed through learning a new language are highly valued by employers across all fields. What's more, learning Russian could give you a head start in learning other Slavic languages, such as Polish or Czech.

By attending science club you will gain hands-on experience through participating in a number of experiments and activities that can boost your practical skills and prepare you for future academic and career opportunities.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? Science club will boost problem-solving skills, critical thinking abilities, teamwork, creativity, and a deeper understanding of science related subjects.

The skills that will be gained within SPARX Club are confidence in the subject of mathematics as well as the confidence to ask questions. Problem solving and how to think like a mathematician are another two skill that will be gained throughout. Creativity to solve mathematical problems by thinking outside the box.

Summary

The board game club is for pupils between year 7 and 10. It is designed to enhance student's cognitive, language and social development in a fun and engaging environment.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain?

Through a variety of different strategies; word based and cooperative board games; pupils will improve their critical thinking, problem solving and decision-making skills. Additionally, the club will encourage teamwork, social interaction, empathy, build friendships and boost confidence.

Termly Overview

Week	Content

Digital Skills

Summary

Digital Skills uses an online web-based software called Canva to teach students about different aspects of content creation such as video editing, logo design, presentations to name just a few.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? By the end of the 12 weeks, students will have gained skills in both Canva's graphic design and video editing features, ready to create a variety of media content.

Course Focus:

- Creativity and design application.
- Effective use of Canva tools, including video editing.
- Visual and multimedia communication skills.

Dungeons and Dragons

Summary

It is a cooperative, storytelling game where you and other players take on the roles of different characters within a story. As you play, your character will make friends and enemies, fight monsters, discover loot, and complete quests. But while the goal of many games is to score the most points or win, the ultimate goal of D&D is to tell a story.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? Communication with others, turn taking, using imagination, maths skills and lateral thinking.

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How Does it Link to Future Careers?

Critical thinking, debating, engaging with others and thinking for themselves.

Summary

Students will create a concept for an app and create the interface screens (home page, menu, and 1–2 feature pages) in Adobe Illustrator for their own app concept.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? Pupils will be working with an industry experienced teacher to help develop confidence with Adobe Illustrator. They will understand the principles of interface design (clarity, usability, visual hierarchy) and design an app idea that has meaning to themselves - eg (wellness, gaming, service, social impact, etc.). They will also create a small portfolio piece that could be presented or pitched to industry.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? Students will learn different stitches, which when put together will enable them to create different items and to eventually follow a crochet pattern. This allows them to discover new passions and gain a broader perspective on their abilities, engaging their imagination, design and performance skills.

Learning to crochet will help to develop your patience and commitment to a project and enhance project management skills. You will develop the tenacity to see a project through to its end and be rewarded by its success. Crochet also helps with dexterity, and fine motor skills.

There is a huge online presence of crocheters who have made a very successful career of producing beautiful garments, writing patterns and much more!

TaskMaster Club

Summary

Based on the popular TV show TaskMaster, students will have the opportunity to complete challenges from the Task Master Education programme along with their peers each week. Each half term, students will engage with programme material, work as a team and independently, use quick and creative thinking and ultimately, have lots of fun trying to complete entertaining, thought-provoking challenges. The Taskmaster will set a task each week, show videos and resources from the enrichment programme and then judge the groups and their efforts to complete the tasks. Should students choose to engage with the club year long, they can still achieve their enrichment diploma due to the all-rounded nature of the club!

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain?

Public speaking/confidence - showing how you will complete each task in front of other groups. Teamwork/leadership/communication- compromising with other students to come up with creative and innovative ways to complete each task. Flexible thinking/problem solving/resilience- not always completing the task in the most obvious way to beat other teams.

Termly Overview

Week	Content
1 - 12	Each week, students will watch clips from the Task Master Education program, team up and best complete the tasks that are set. Each task will be unique, encompassing a variety of skills needed and being harnessed. Students will have the chance to show these efforts to the wider group and enjoy watching others do the same. Students will receive certificates for being in the winning team!

How Does it Link to Future Careers?

Students build on their problem solving and reasoning skills, readying them for future challenges during their GCSEs, post-16 education and future careers. The same applies to team work and collaboration, both beneficial for students' futures. Finally, and most importantly, students get the chance to build up their self-confidence and self-esteem: different skills are used each week meaning that all students should be able to showcase their strengths and work on their weaknesses together in a light-hearted and amusing environment.



Creative

The Hook and Pen Society

Summary

A blend of hands-on craft and mindful reflection in a cozy environment.

A chance to be creative in a calm and friendly space.

E.g. gratitude jars, coasters, book covers, bookmarks, journalling and much more.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? Learn how to crochet, incorporating various mindful activities. You will learn how to self express in a way that pleases the individual. You can either work alone to create independence or as part of a group to create a larger piece. Mindfulness is a great skill to cope with day to day life at school.

Termly Overview

The REP Theatre Performing Arts Club

Summary

Pupils will be working with professional staff from the Birmingham Rep Theatre Company to create high quality performances working with professional theatre-makers.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain?

Pupils will get opportunities to develop their performance skills, learn how an exciting producing theatre works, and grow in confidence.

Young Rep aims to nurture and inspire the next generation of theatre-makers through staging new work, devising original pieces of theatre and performing established texts. It is an inclusive environment that welcomes children and young people from all backgrounds.

Termly Overview

Week	Content
1 - 12	Each week, students will take part in a range of drama workshops using different stimuli and will have the opportunity to construct their own original theatre pieces culminating in the opportunity to perform them live to an audience at the Birmingham Rep Theatre.

How Does it Link to Future Careers?

If you want to work as an actor or within the performing arts, employers can include:

- theatres - including producing and receiving theatres, youth and community theatres
- film, television and radio companies
- marketing companies - for promotional videos
- museums, heritage organisations, tour companies and theme park - for role-playing and bringing to life certain attractions.

You can also find employment with a range of other employers who will value your skills. These include:

- local government
- arts organisations
- education institutions
- the National Health Service (NHS)

Creative

Ultimate Uno

Summary

Uno is a card-based game that can be played between 2-10 players. This makes it versatile so that it can suit small and larger groups of players. Uno is a game that can be adapted in numerous ways with the pickup cards and other special cards. This will be developed across the year, whilst playing the numerous different versions of the game that are available.

What Knowledge / Skills Will I Gain? Uno is a game that will use mathematical skills but also requires you to think tactically about how to try and win. This will promote pupils thinking skills, resilience and articulation skills.

Summary
